- ➤ Greek and Latin are offered alternating biannually with 101 in the fall and 102 in the spring. No placement tests are needed for enrollment in Greek, Latin or Hmong 101, or Ojibwe/AIS 121/LANG 101
- All other Language courses at the 101 level require either a placement exam, AP scores, or college credit as a prerequisite. You may contact the department for permission to enroll without a placement test, if you have never taken that language or it has been more than 3 years since you've taken that language.
- Math (MATH), and Chemistry (CHEM), Economics (ECON), and American Sign Language (ASL) above 101 require a placement exam, AP scores, or college credit as a prerequisite
